Minutes of the Meeting – Discussion on “THE Impact Rankings 2025” held on 30th July (Physical Mode) and 2nd August (Online Mode), 2025

A meeting of all SDG Coordinators, IQAC representatives, and Mr. Santhosh Karnananda, Vice President, Global Consulting Services, was convened under the chairmanship of the Director, IQAC, on 30th July 2025 in physical mode at the IQAC Conference Hall from 02:00 PM onwards. The discussion was continued in online mode on 2nd August 2025. The primary objective of the meeting was to review the requirements and deliberate on the university’s participation in THE Impact Rankings 2025.

The meeting covered key areas, including an orientation on THE Impact Rankings 2025 methodology, clarification of documentation requirements for selected SDGs, and the finalization of responsibilities and coordination strategies for SDG teams. Guidance was also provided on the effective presentation of SDG-related data on the university website, followed by the announcement of the schedule for the next review meeting. The following points were discussed during the meeting:

1. The meeting was commenced by the Director, IQAC, who emphasized the need for a well-structured and strategic approach in preparing for THE Impact Rankings 2025.
2. Mr. Santhosh Karnananda delivered an expert session on the methodology of THE Impact Rankings and institutional readiness.
3. Mandatory inclusion of SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals) was reiterated for all participants.
4. Clarifications were provided on documentation formats and examples for SDG 4 (Quality Education), SDG 5 (Gender Equality), and some points related to SDG 17 were also discussed.

5. Examples of valid documentation include MoUs, policy documents, gender audits, energy data, water audit reports, and website evidence was provided.
6. Emphasis was placed on presenting SDG-related activities effectively on the institutional website using visuals, infographics, and categorized repositories.
6. Coordinators for each selected SDG were finalized to streamline efforts and responsibilities.
7. All doubts from SDG coordinators were addressed directly by Mr. Karnananda.
8. Recommendations were made to upload real-time progress updates and impact stories to the university website.
9. Use of clear document naming conventions and links to verifiable evidence was strongly encouraged.

As the discussion on 30th July 2025 remained incomplete, it was resumed in online mode on 2nd August 2025. During this session, the following points were discussed:

10. Subharti University must determine its per-person water consumption figure, maintain updated records, and demonstrate initiatives to conserve water, use it appropriately, and protect its quality and quantity.
11. Develop and implement a Recycled Water Policy, and ensure the functionality and efficiency of the STP and ETP.
12. Follow water-conscious building norms and standards in all new construction and renovations.
13. Introduce and promote water management education, including activity-based learning, in reach and outreach programs for students and staff.
14. Provide leadership in water conservation within the campus and local community, encouraging contributions from all departments.
15. Upgrade existing buildings to meet higher energy efficiency standards, incorporating carbon and emission reduction measures, and maintain documentation for THE Impact Rankings.
16. Continue and expand solar energy and solar water heating systems, and promote clean energy efforts to move toward becoming a “Clean University.”
17. Prepare policies, including a Divestment Policy and a Clean Energy Technology Policy, to guide sustainable energy adoption.
18. Conduct a comprehensive energy audit to assess consumption patterns and identify savings opportunities.
19. Organize community programs, commitment pledges, and student industrial visits promoting energy efficiency and clean energy practices, with photographic documentation.
20. Compile and promote achievements and supported start-ups focused on low-carbon innovation and renewable projects.
21. Document and showcase campus healthcare facilities, counseling services, telemedicine, and free or subsidized healthcare provided to the local community.
22. Highlight health outreach activities such as camps, vaccination drives, blood donation, and mental health awareness events.
23. Maintain and showcase health-related research publications, funded projects, patents, collaborations, and student-led initiatives.

24. Promote sports, fitness, yoga, and inter-university events, recording participation and wellness outcomes.
25. Develop and implement policies for a tobacco-free, drug-free, and mental health-friendly campus, along with workplace wellness for staff and faculty.
26. Organize regular health awareness campaigns through NSS, NCC, and Medical College in partnership with NGOs, health agencies, and hospitals.
27. Strengthen and document local, national, and international partnerships aligned with the SDGs, maintaining MoUs, agreements, and joint project records.
28. Collaborate with NGOs and government agencies for SDG policy development and best practice sharing in sustainability, water, clean energy, and health.
29. Compile and promote joint research publications, funded projects, academic exchanges, conferences, and workshops linked to SDG themes.
30. Develop sustainability literacy programs and workshops in collaboration with partner organizations.
31. Document training programs, internships, exchange opportunities, shared infrastructure, and technical expertise provided through partnerships.
32. Strengthen industry and government collaborations for internships, placements, research, and community development projects.
33. Participate in international networks, forums, and consortia, leveraging global partnerships for student/faculty mobility programs.
34. Ensure all partnership-related data is accessible on the University's public website in compliance with THE Impact Rankings.

Decisions Taken:

1. All SDG teams will finalize their assigned documentation using the suggested formats.
2. The University website will be updated to create a dedicated SDG section with proper structure and visual content.
3. Per-person water consumption data will be calculated, documented, and supported by water conservation initiatives, including a Recycled Water Policy and efficient STP/ETP operations.
4. All new constructions and renovations will follow water-conscious and energy-efficient building norms; an energy audit will be conducted.
5. Renewable energy use, particularly solar systems, will be expanded, and sustainable energy policies will be formulated.
6. Health services, outreach programs, and related research will be documented and strengthened, alongside sports, wellness, and mental health initiatives.
7. Strategic partnerships for SDG-related activities, research, and training will be expanded at local, national, and international levels.
8. All partnership, sustainability, and achievement data will be made publicly accessible on the University website for THE Impact Rankings.
