Introduction

The United Nations Sustainable Development Goal 11 (SDG 11) aims to **"Make cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient, and sustainable."** This goal focuses on key areas such as access to safe and affordable housing, sustainable transport systems, inclusive and participatory urban planning, reducing the environmental impact of cities, and providing universal access to safe, inclusive, and accessible green and public spaces.

Swami Vivekanand Subharti University, Meerut, has demonstrated its commitment to the objectives of SDG 11 through various environmental and community-focused initiatives, which directly contribute to creating a more sustainable and resilient campus community and its surrounding areas.

Key initiatives taken by the university, aligned with SDG 11 targets:

1. Affordable and Sustainable Transport Systems (aligned with indicator 11.2)

The university promotes sustainable transport within its campus to reduce its environmental footprint:

- **Battery-Operated Vehicles:** The university uses **battery-operated rickshaws, scooters** for in-campus transportation. Students are also encouraged to build and use similar vehicles.




Fig. 1.0: The university has adopted battery-operated vehicles for its campus shuttle service, promoting a more sustainable environment.

- **Car-Free Days:** The university observes a **"Car Free Day"** every Tuesday and Wednesday to encourage the use of non-motorized transport, walking, and cycling, promoting a cleaner environment and road safety.

- **Pedestrian Paths:** Promoting **pedestrian walking paths** and **carpooling** further supports sustainable commuting.

2. Building Healthy and Livable Cities for Future Generations: (aligned with indicator 11.6)

The university has implemented various measures focused on resource efficiency and waste management:

- **Renewable Energy:** A significant step is the installation of a **2 MW solar power plant** on campus, which reduces carbon dioxide emissions and saves a substantial amount of coal and prevents deforestation.

- **Energy Efficiency:** The campus utilizes **sensor-based lights** in walkways, lobbies, and staircases to conserve electricity by only powering lights when motion is detected.

- Waste Management:** The university initiates, encourages, and ensures the **segregation of waste** and its adequate disposal. Students participate in **recycling green waste into compost** using NADEP and pit composting methods.




Fig. 1.5: The university initiates and ensures waste segregation.

- E-waste Disposal:** The university ensures **e-waste** (non-working computers, printers, etc.) is periodically written off and disposed of to **certified vendors** as per prevailing norms.

- **Water Conservation:** Initiatives include **rainwater harvesting systems** and connecting drain pipes to **recharge pits** to conserve water. Solar water heater plants are also installed on hostel rooftops.

3. Provide Access to Safe and Inclusive Green and Public Spaces (aligning with 11.7)

The campus itself serves as a model for green infrastructure and public space:

- **Green Infrastructure:** The university's **eye-catching landscaping** and regular **plantation drives** help maintain a pollution-free and aesthetically pleasing environment. They actively work to **prepare a green belt** to reduce their carbon footprint.

- **Biodiversity:** The institution's environmental vision includes implementing habitat restoration projects and establishing protected areas to safeguard local flora and fauna.

- **Community Outreach:** The university organizes various camps (*Health Checkup, Legal Aid, Educational, etc.*) and activities like *Nukkad Natak* (street plays) in **neighbouring communities** to raise awareness on health, environment, and social issues.




Fig. 2.4: Village – Pepla, District – Meerut, Uttar Pradesh, India

Details of the activities (*aligned with UN SDG 11*) conducted by the Swami Vivekanand Subharti University, Meerut during the academic year 2023-2024:

Environmental Sustainability and Green Campus Initiatives

1. World Environment Day Celebrations

The World Environment Day was organized by the Environment Committee and various faculties to raise awareness on environmental protection, tree planting, pollution control, and responsible consumption. It encouraged students to adopt eco-friendly habits both on and off campus.



2. Tree Plantation Program

A large-scale plantation drive promoting green cover and carbon absorption within campus and nearby communities — a step towards combating climate change and urban pollution.



3. Plantation Drive by University Environment Committee

A campus beautification and oxygen enrichment initiative, encouraging students and faculty to take personal responsibility for green infrastructure.



4. World Ozone Day Celebration

Department of Environmental Engineering, Faculty of Engineering and Technology, Swami Vivekanand Subharti University, Meerut in association with University Environment Committee organized an event on the occasion of World Ozone Day. In the event, poster competition, quiz competition, Skit and Lecture were organized.



5. Sustainable and Mission LiFE Program

The Faculty of Engineering & Technology, Swami Vivekananda Subharti University organized a workshop on “sustainable and mission life and also practice promoting life actions” on 23rd May 2023. The workshop on sustainable and mission life action, inspired by the vision of India and hon’ble Prime Minister Narendra Modi, aimed to create awareness and promote practical steps towards a sustainable and mission-oriented lifestyle. Focused on lifestyle changes for environment (LiFE) — encouraging sustainable consumption, resource efficiency, and reduction of waste to build resilient communities.



6. National Paryavaran Competition

The National Paryavaran Competition (NSPC) is an online event organized by Paryavaran Sanrakshan Gatividhi (PSG) in collaboration with Unnat Bharat Abhiyan Subject Expert Group-Environment and

Sustainable Resource Management and promoted by the University Grants Commission (UGC) with the aim of fostering environmental awareness among students. Inter-university competition spreading awareness about biodiversity conservation, climate action, and community-level environmental responsibility.



7. International Symposium on Natural Agriculture for a Sustainable World (6 Oct 2023)

The Faculty of Science, Swami Vivekanand Subharti University, Meerut has promoted sustainable agricultural practices, organic farming, and reduced chemical use — crucial for urban-rural ecosystem balance by organising the one-day international symposium.



8. Green Chemistry: Myths and Reality – Sustainable Development through Science

A guest lecture on was organized by the Department of Chemistry at Keral Verma Subharti College of Science for UG and PG students. The seminar emphasizing safe chemical usage, waste reduction, and eco-friendly lab practices to minimize environmental impact.



9. Seminar on “Culture Heritage, Environment & Water Conservation”

The Faculty of AYUSH, Swami Vivekanand Subharti University, Meerut has organised a guest lecture that focused on preserving natural resources and traditional knowledge related to sustainable living, emphasizing harmony between culture and ecology.



10. Awareness Program on “Save Mother Earth, Save Life”

The Faculty of AYUSH, Swami Vivekanand Subharti University, Meerut has organised an outreach event promoting responsible citizenship for protecting nature, tackling pollution, and managing urban waste.



Clean, Safe, and Inclusive Communities

11. Swachata Abhiyan under ‘Swachhata Hi Sewa Abhiyan’

NSS volunteers and the students of Department of Journalism and Mass Communication, Faculty of Arts and Social Science cleaned public areas around campus, inspiring community participation for sustainable urban spaces. During this, these volunteers also gave the message of clean India, healthy India to the people coming and going. The volunteers made the public aware about cleanliness and health.



12. Visit to Sewage Treatment Plant and Waste Management Site

The students of the Faculty of Law, Sardar Patel Subharti Institute of Law, participated in environmental visits within the campus. The visit was scheduled to the Sewage Treatment Plant (STP), followed by a visit to the Solid and Biomedical Waste Management Plant by the all batches of BALLB and LL.M. Students learned about scientific waste disposal and water recycling — practical exposure to sustainable infrastructure and environmental engineering.



13. Training Program for Underprivileged Women

Swami Vivekanand Subharti University is deeply committed to the UN Sustainable Development Goals, with a particular focus on Goal No. 3, which emphasizes “Good Health and Well-being.” In line with this commitment, the Shaheed Baba Deep Singh Department of Home Science has taken an important initiative to raise awareness among underprivileged females, including non-teaching staff and wage laborers of Subharti University, regarding menstrual health, hygiene, the significance of using sanitary napkins and enhancing employability. The activity is focused on vocational skill-building and self-reliance, contributing to social and economic inclusion within local communities.



14. Community Sensitization and Training Programs

Faculty of Law led awareness sessions on civic rights, safety, and cleanliness, strengthening the link between education and community well-being.



15. Extension Activity on Community Engagement and Social Responsibility

Swami Vivekanand Subharti University’s Keral Varma Subharti College of Science organized an outreach activity on community engagement and social responsibility under the ‘Unnat Bharat Abhiyan’ of the Ministry of Education, Government of India. Students participated in activities improving local sanitation and hygiene infrastructure — promoting partnership between university and society.

17. Cycle Rally on Bicycle Day
