# Report on UN SDG 16 — Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions



University's contributions in achieving  
UN SDG — 16  
Year - 2024

**Sustainable Development Goal 16 – Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions** focuses on promoting peaceful and inclusive societies, providing access to justice for all, and building effective, accountable and inclusive institutions. In 2024, **Swami Vivekanand Subharti University, Meerut** took a deliberately integrated approach to SDG 16 by combining:

- **Legal literacy and awareness activities,**
- **Free legal aid and outreach** in nearby villages,
- **Youth parliaments and Constitution-focused events,**
- **Vigilance and anti-corruption education,** and
- **Policy-level commitments** like anti-ragging mechanisms and institutional legal aid structures.

The initiatives were led chiefly by **Sardar Patel Subharti Institute of Law (Subharti Law College)**, the **Swami Vivekanand Chair**, the **Faculty of Arts & Social Sciences**, the **Department of Journalism & Mass Communication**, and central university authorities, in collaboration with agencies such as the **District Legal Services Authority (DLSA), Meerut** and **Dedicated Freight Corridor Corporation of India Ltd (DFCCIL)**.

## **Institutional Framework for Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions**

University's **Faculty of Law** operates as a key institutional pillar for SDG 16. The Sardar Patel Subharti Institute of Law provides structured exposure to **legal aid camps, internships, moot courts and court-oriented training**, preparing students to serve as future judges, advocates, civil servants and human-rights defenders.

The **Subharti Free Legal Aid Clinic** and **Law Club** run regular outreach programmes in nearby rural communities, offering **free legal counselling** and connecting citizens with government schemes.



The **moot court infrastructure** and frequent competitions simulate real-world court environments, promoting respect for due process, fair hearing and meticulous legal research—core values of strong justice institutions.

## 2.2 Policies for Safe and Just Campus: Anti-Ragging and Discipline

SVSU maintains a **University Anti-Ragging Squad and Anti-Ragging Committees** across its constituent colleges. These bodies were updated/notified in 2024, clearly listing responsible officers and procedures to prevent and address ragging and harassment.

In 2024, colleges such as the **Fine Arts and Fashion Design College** conducted **anti-ragging orientation sessions**, addressed by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, to sensitise new students on their rights, responsibilities and the consequences of ragging or violence on campus.

Together with **Internal Complaints Committees (ICC)**, grievance-redressal mechanisms and codes of conduct, these policies embed SDG 16 principles—safe, inclusive and rights-respecting institutions—into everyday campus governance.

## **Legal Literacy and Awareness Week 2024 (19–25 November)**

In **November 2024**, Sardar Patel Subharti Institute of Law organised “**Legal Literacy and Awareness Week – 2024**” to spread constitutional awareness among students and the wider community. The week-long programme explicitly recognised legal literacy as a **constitutional obligation of citizens** towards the nation.



The schedule included:

- **Awareness Walk** (19 November)
- **Free Legal Aid Camp** in Village Jhitakri, Tehsil Sardhana (20 November)
- **Legal Opinion Drafting Competition** (21 November)
- **Youth Parliament sessions and Poster Competition** (22–23 November)
- **Awareness e-Quiz on Fundamental Duties** (24 November)
- **Awareness Talk on “Know Your Constitution”** (25 November).

Directed by **Justice (Retd.) Rajesh Chandra** (Director, Law College) and **Prof. (Dr.) Vaibhav Goel Bhartiya** (Dean, Faculty of Law), and coordinated by faculty members such as **Dr. Sarika Tyagi, Prof. (Dr.) Reena Bishnoi** and **Ms. Afreen Almas**, the week ensured **active student participation** in every activity, from awareness walks to drafting and debating.

This initiative advances SDG 16 by:

- Building **legal and constitutional literacy** among youth,
- Bringing **free legal services** to rural citizens, and
- Encouraging **participation in democratic processes** through youth parliament sessions and quizzes.

## **Free Legal Aid Camp and Awareness Programme – Arnawli Village**

Beyond the Jhitakri camp, the **Law Club / Free Legal Aid Cell** organised another **Legal Aid Camp and Awareness Programme** in **Arnawli village, Block Rohta**, under the guidance of the Dean, Faculty of Law and Director, Subharti Institute of Law, and in coordination with the **District Legal Services Authority (DLSA)**.



Key features included:

- Explaining the role of the **Subharti Free Legal Aid Clinic** in providing **free legal services** to those who cannot afford representation;
- Detailed information on **central and state welfare schemes** relating to health, education, and financial assistance, and guidance on using portals like **MyScheme** and the **National Portal of India**;
- A dedicated session on the **new criminal law codes**—*Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita*, *Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita* and *Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam*—which replace the former IPC, CrPC and Evidence Act, including explanation of concepts like community service for petty offences and updated provisions on terrorism;
- An **interactive Q&A** where villagers could ask questions related to legal rights, schemes and new laws.

The camp empowered villagers by:

- Enhancing their **awareness of rights and remedies**,
- Bridging the gap between **citizens and legal/administrative institutions**, and
- Demonstrating the **practical working of access to justice**, a core SDG 16 target

## Swami Vivekanand Chhatra Sansad 2024 – Youth Parliament

As part of the Legal Literacy & Awareness Week and under the **Tarun Sabha, National Youth Parliament Scheme of the Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs**, SVSU organised the **Swami Vivekanand Chhatra Sansad 2024** on 22–23 November 2024.



The **Moot Court Association** and **Literary Club** coordinated this inter-collegiate event, which saw participation from **51 student delegates**. Debates revolved around three critical agendas:

1. **Election Reforms,**
2. **Human Rights vs National Security – AFSPA, and**
3. **Women’s Participation in the Workforce.**

The structure resembled the working of Parliament:

- Delegates acted as ruling and opposition members,
- A Speaker and Deputy Speaker (alumni) oversaw proceedings,
- A formal **parliamentary oath** was administered,
- Question Hour allowed rigorous questioning of the “government” by the Opposition.

This event embodies SDG 16 by:

- Training students in **deliberative democracy,**
- Encouraging **respectful debate on human rights and security,** and
- Building capacity to engage with **institutional reform and public policy.**

## Constitution Day 2024: Seminars, Quizzes and Civic Education

On **Constitution Day (Samvidhan Diwas)**, Sardar Patel Subharti Institute of Law organised a comprehensive seminar titled “**Upholding the Spirit of Indian Constitution**”, along with a series of competitions leading up to it.



## Highlights:

- A chain of events—**Preamble recitation, quiz, essay writing and poster making**—organised collaboratively with various faculties (Arts & Social Sciences, Technology & Engineering, Science, Management and Commerce).
- The seminar itself was conducted **in association with DLSA, Meerut**, bringing **judicial officers** (Additional Civil Judges and the DLSA Secretary) to campus to speak on the importance of the Constitution, rule of law, and legal aid.
- Speakers and dignitaries—including the **Vice Chancellor Maj. Gen (Dr.) G.K. Thapliyal (Retd.)**, senior professors and DLSA officials—emphasised that the Constitution is a **social contract** guaranteeing rights, imposing duties and providing a democratic framework.

## The seminar underlined:

- Respect for **fundamental rights and duties**,
- The need to **sensitise the public** on constitutional values, and
- The responsibility of universities to uphold **“Shiksha, Seva, Sanskar and Rashtriyata”** in line with constitutional spirit.

## Quiz Competition on the 75th Constitution Day

The **Faculty of Arts & Social Sciences** conducted a **quiz competition** on **22 November 2024** to mark the **75th Constitution Day**. More than 100 students from various departments participated.



- The quiz focused on the **making, structure, features, rights, duties and institutions** of the Indian Constitution.
- Leaders such as **Prof. Sudhir Tyagi** and **Dr. Deshraj Singh** highlighted that knowing the Constitution builds confidence and enables citizens to function as efficient administrators in their spheres. [Subharti University News](#)

These efforts build **constitutional literacy across disciplines**, directly supporting SDG 16 targets on **promoting rule of law and ensuring equal access to justice and information**.

## Vigilance Awareness Week 2024 – Integrity and Anti-Corruption

To observe **Vigilance Awareness Week (VAW) 2024**, the **Department of Journalism & Mass Communication** and **Subharti Law College** hosted a joint workshop on “**Culture of Integrity for Nation’s Prosperity**” in collaboration with the **Dedicated Freight Corridor Corporation of India Ltd (DFCCIL)**, Meerut.

- Officers from DFCCIL explained the purpose of Vigilance Awareness Week, stressing that **integrity and transparency** are essential for building a better society.
- The **Public Interest Disclosure and Protection of Informers (whistle-blower) mechanism** under the “Public Disclosure Protection and Prevention of Corruption Act (PDPI)” and the role of the **Central Vigilance Commission (CVC)** were discussed in detail.
- Students, teachers and non-teaching staff were informed about how citizens can use legal channels to report corruption and how whistle-blowers are protected.



A separate **closing ceremony of Vigilance Awareness Week** at SVSU involved the **Vice Chancellor**, political representatives, former High Court judge Justice Rajesh Chandra, medical faculty and the Dean, Faculty of Law. The event focused on the **importance of vigilance, transparency and accountability** in public life and institutions.



By educating youth on anti-corruption frameworks and citizen participation, SVSU contributes directly to SDG 16 targets on **reducing corruption and bribery** and developing **effective, accountable institutions**.

## **12th Sardar Patel Subharti Moot Court Competition 2024**

On **16–17 October 2024**, the **12th Sardar Patel Subharti Moot Court Competition** was organised by the Moot Court Association.

- **19 teams** participated, arguing as both appellants and respondents across preliminary, semi-final and final rounds.
- Multiple internal and external judges, including senior faculty members, evaluated the teams on legal research, drafting and oral advocacy. [Subharti University News](#)
- The competition involved detailed **problem analysis, structured written submissions and formal court etiquette**, mirroring the functioning of real appellate courts.

- Awards were given for **Best Team, Runner-Up, Best Mooter and Best Researcher**, and volunteers served as court masters to manage the proceedings. [Subharti University News](#)

Moot courts are a powerful pedagogical tool for SDG 16 because they:

- Cultivate **respect for fair trial and due process**,
- Train students to **defend rights and interpret laws** responsibly, and
- Promote a culture of **ethical lawyering and judicial standards**.



## Student-Centric Legal Awareness Drive (February 2024)

SVSU's AQAR 2024 documentation notes a **Legal Awareness Drive** organised by law students on **23 February 2024**, as part of the university's Institutional Social Responsibility initiatives.

While detailed narrative is in internal documents, such drives typically include:

- Street-level outreach on basic legal rights (e.g., rights of women, children, senior citizens),
- Distribution of pamphlets on **legal aid, helplines and grievance mechanisms**,
- Short talks on how to access **police, courts and government offices** in a respectful, lawful manner.

These activities further SDG 16 by demystifying institutions and encouraging citizens to rely on **lawful processes** rather than informal or violent channels.

## Anti-Ragging Orientations and Safe Campus Culture

Alongside formal committees, SVSU actively promotes a **culture of peace and non-violence** on campus through:

- **Anti-ragging orientation programmes** in 2024 (e.g., Fine Arts and Fashion Design College), where the Vice Chancellor addressed students on respect, empathy and the legal consequences of ragging;



- Public display of helpline numbers, anti-ragging posters, and detailed committees published in official notifications and college websites;
- Integration of **ethics, discipline and human values** into cultural and academic events, in line with the university motto.

These measures support SDG 16's call to **promote peaceful and inclusive societies** and **provide safe and non-violent learning environments** for all.

## How These 2024 Initiatives Map to SDG 16 Targets

Across 2024, SVSU's initiatives collectively addressed multiple **SDG 16 targets**:

  - Vigilance Awareness Week workshops with DFCCIL and university-wide anti-corruption talks;
- **16.6: Develop effective, accountable and transparent institutions**
  - Strengthened legal aid structures, collaboration with DLSA, and institutionalised outreach;
  - Anti-ragging mechanisms and grievance committees.
- **16.7: Ensure responsive, inclusive, participatory and representative decision-making**
  - Swami Vivekanand Chhatra Sansad (Youth Parliament) and Constitution Day quizzes and essay/poster competitions, involving multiple faculties;
  - Panel discussion on women in nation-building and National Youth Day-themed events.
- **16.b: Promote and enforce non-discriminatory laws and policies for sustainable development**
  - Emphasis on equality, non-discrimination and women's leadership across events;
  - Awareness of new criminal laws and expanded rights and protections.

In 2024, **Swami Vivekanand Subharti University, Meerut** demonstrated that a university can go beyond academic teaching to become an **active partner in building peaceful, just and strong institutions**.

- Through **legal literacy weeks, youth parliaments, legal aid camps and Constitution-day activities**, SVSU ensured that students understand the **spirit and functioning of democratic institutions**.
- **Vigilance Awareness Week** brought anti-corruption mechanisms and citizens' rights into sharp focus.
- **Moot court competitions, panel discussions and awareness drives** built practical skills and ethical perspectives necessary to uphold justice and human rights.

- **Anti-ragging and safe-campus frameworks** guarded the learning environment, ensuring that peace and dignity are non-negotiable.
