UN SDGs 17 – Partnerships for the Goals

Introduction

Partnerships for the Goals, is one of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals established by the United Nations in 2015. It aims to strengthen the means of implementation and revitalize the global partnership for sustainable development. It emphasizes the importance of collaboration and cooperation among governments, the private sector, and civil society to achieve sustainable development. In the context of education, this goal highlights the necessity of partnerships to enhance educational opportunities and outcomes globally.

Swami Vivekanand Subharti University signs Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) with other industry/institutions in order to carry out a range of significant programs like faculty exchange, student exchange, academics, clinical training, internship, on-the-job training, project work, collaborative research programmes, employability and skill development etc. that contribute to the SDGs in addition to providing the community with high-quality education.

17.1 Research into partnership for the goals

Swami Vivekanand Subharti University, Meerut, is actively promoting equitable international research collaborations with low and lower-middle income countries. During the academic year 2023–24, the university informed all constituent colleges, visiting, adjunct, and international faculty, as well as foreign students, about this initiative. The objective is to enhance the proportion of research outputs co-authored with partners from such countries.

The university's Office of the International Students & Global Relations (IS&GR) provided guidelines for tracking and reporting co-authored publications. Departments were instructed to maintain records and submit quarterly reports of such collaborations. Visiting and adjunct faculty were encouraged to initiate joint research and mentor young researchers from partner countries. International students were motivated to engage in cross-border research projects.

The process is designed to be progressive and capacity-building, not merely compliance-based. It aims to foster ethical, mutually beneficial, and sustainable partnerships. The university views this as part of its long-term strategy to promote inclusive and globally connected research excellence.

17.1.2 Partnerships for the goals: publications:

The university's strong record of Scopus and Web of Science-indexed publications, with an institutional H-index of 26, underscores its commitment to high-quality research and academic

excellence. Faculty members actively publish their research in CiteScore-recognised journals, ensuring the dissemination of credible and impactful scholarly work.

17.2 Relationships to support the goals

This emphasizes building strong partnerships, dialogues, networks and collaborations to enable implementation of the SDGs. To implement relationships and support the goals, the University organizes the Joint events & stakeholder dialogue, collaborating with external organisations & agencies, and established academic chair promoting social philosophy & cooperation.


1. The purpose of this MoU is to develop academic and educational co-operation and to promote mutual understanding between the two Parties.

5. Both Parties agree that prior written approval is required before using the other party's name, logo, or other intellectual property rights in any advertising or associated publicity.
6. Should the collaborative research activities under this MoU result in any potential for intellectual property, each Party shall seek an equitable and fair agreement as to ownership and other property interests that may arise.
7. This MoU may only be amended or modified by a written agreement signed by the representatives of each Party.
8. This MoU shall become effective on the date on which it is signed by the Parties. This MoU can be amended or terminated by the mutual consent of the Parties. It will remain in effect unless there are any disagreements between the Parties.

Preamble

Dong Bang Buddhist University, Seoul, South Korea hereinafter called DBBU, is registered under the law of South Korea.

Swami Vivekanand Subharti University, Meerut, UP, India under Uttar Pradesh Govt. State Act No. 29 of 2008, hereinafter called SVSU.

With the view of promoting cooperation in academic education and research between DBBU and SVSU the following agreement is established:

Article 1

Both parties hereby agree, in general, to promote Buddhist Studies and to disseminate the Buddha's teachings to the world without limitation of race, caste and religion. The cooperation may concern any field or subject upon which the parties agree. It will include various activities, such as:

- 1) Collaborative research, lectures and symposia
- 2) Exchange of scholars and researchers
- 3) Exchange of students
- 4) Exchange of information and materials in fields which are of interest to both parties

This general agreement shall ensure that appropriate arrangements are made before the arrival of a faculty/institute member or a student to the host Academy/University.

Article 2

A specific plan shall be worked out for each joint activity. Further discussion on this specific plan as well as supplementary document(s) are needed.

Specific objectives are as follows:-

- To promote education and research activities about Buddhism.
- To provide basic assistance for the establishment of Subharti School of Buddhist Studies at SVSU.
- To design program, develop course curriculum and decide course fee/accommodation etc., for various courses on Buddhist Studies.
- To organize the seminars and conferences on Buddhism at SVSU.

- To assist faculty members of SVSU for a development of research program at the School of Buddhist Studies.
- To work for the preservation and development of Buddhist art and culture.
- To cooperate on both academic and technological aspects in order to achieve the goal.

Implementation of general and specific kinds of cooperation based on this agreement shall be the concern of the relevant faculties/departments or institutes on a case-by-case basis.

Article 3

DBBU. as well as SVSU shall seek finance of joint activities from sources available to them.

Article 4

This agreement will be effective for ten years (10 years) which can be extended as agreed by both parties.

Any activity upon which the parties have already agreed or already in progress shall be carried out as planned even after the date of termination of the present agreement, unless the parties agree otherwise in writing.

Article 5

This agreement is written in English in two originals, both of equal validity. If translations of the agreements have been made, in any case of dispute the English text shall prevail.

This MoU is signed between SVSU and DBBU. There are no financial commitments to either party of this agreement.



- d) The obligations and opportunities under this MoU are non-exclusive, and the partners may enter into other agreements to achieve the same goals.

ARTICLE 5: VALIDITY, AMENDMENT AND TERMINATION

- a) This MoU shall be made in English and shall become effective as of the date of signatures of both partners.
- b) This MoU may be modified through mutual discussion and consent of the two partners. Any agreed modifications and/or amendments made during the validity period of the MoU shall be made as appendix to this MoU.
- c) Upon approval by each partner, this MoU shall remain in effect in five-year term and be automatically renewed in the next five years unless any termination is raised. Termination of the MoU shall require a minimum of six months advance notice by either party and shall be without penalty. If this MoU is terminated, neither partner shall be liable to the other for any monetary or other losses which may result. Activities in progress at the time of termination of this MoU shall be permitted to conclude as planned unless otherwise agreed.



6. Academic Record and Accreditation

The host institution shall evaluate the academic performance of each exchange student according to its rules and shall send the home institution the academic record/transcript of each exchange student. The home institution may give credit to each student according to its regulations.

7. Tuition, Fees, and Expenses

Provided they have paid the appropriate tuition and fees to their home institution, exchange students shall not be required to pay tuition or fees at the host institution. Other costs, including accommodation, international travel, books, supplies, meals, health insurance, and other incidental expenses arising out of the exchange, will be the responsibility of the exchange student. The host institution will seek to accommodate exchange students on campus wherever necessary. When possible, both institutions will attempt to provide financial assistance to exchange students.

8. Insurance

Students from both institutions shall either purchase adequate insurance or be covered by home institution's insurance plan to meet both institutions' requirements.

9. Government Requirements

Exchange students will meet all requirements of the host country as regards immigration, including where appropriate, arrangements for their family members and dependents. Exchange students shall ensure that they keep their host institution fully informed of their movements and their contact details during the period of their exchange. The host institution will act as the point of contact with the student.

10. Commencement and Duration of the Agreement


This Agreement may be modified through the mutual discussion and consent of the two universities, and shall remain in effect from the date of signature for an initial period of five (5) years. Thereafter it shall be automatically renewed each year; however, after the initial period either university may terminate the agreement by giving six (6) months written notice of such intent.

In the event that either party terminates the Agreement, the host institution shall honor the terms of the Agreement for students whose exchange has been approved prior to termination, as if the Agreement remained in force for the period of exchange.







1. Purpose

3. Scope of Policy

- Students, staff, and research scholars engaged in sustainability-related learning and practice.

4. Strategic Commitments

4.1 Curriculum Integration

Initiatives taken by the university on SDG 17.4.1 (2024)

Curriculum Integration:

The university has embedded SDG-related themes across diverse disciplines, ensuring that sustainability education is not siloed but pervasive. *Examples include:*

Engineering & Technology: MoUs with industry partners (e.g., [Tata Consultancy Services](#)) for sustainable innovation (SDG 9).

This is a formal Service Agreement between Swami Vivekanand Subharti University and Tata Consultancy Services Ltd. (TCS) under the TCS iON Industry Honour Program. TCS appoints SVSU as a non-exclusive intermediary to distribute and deliver TCS iON's industry-aligned digital training content (elective courses) to students. The university is responsible for marketing, infrastructure, training delivery, and student assessments, while TCS provides the content, platform, and certification. The agreement includes strict confidentiality, intellectual property protection, and payment terms (pre-paid licenses, non-refundable). It is valid for five years (2019-2024) and focuses on enhancing employability through skill-based courses in engineering, IT, and emerging technologies.

SDG Links:

This agreement primarily supports SDG 4 (Quality Education) by providing accessible, industry-relevant digital learning and skill development. It advances SDG 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth) through internship opportunities, placement assistance, and improved employability. The focus on technology and innovation aligns with SDG 9 (Industry, Innovation, and Infrastructure). Additionally, it contributes to SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals) by fostering academia-industry collaboration to bridge skill gaps and promote sustainable economic growth. The inclusion of entrepreneurship and IP management also supports SDG 9 and SDG 8

Management & Humanities: The university conducted the seminars on rural development, farmers' rights, and ethical IPR practices in support of SDGs 1, 2, 16.

Mandatory Components: The university started Value-added courses and research methodology workshops that are integral to curricula.

Research & Innovation: Workshops on "Research Methodology," "IPR Patents," and "Computer-Aided Drug Design" to foster SDG-aligned innovation.

Partnerships: International MoUs (e.g., with universities in South Korea, Vietnam) for student exchanges and collaborative research. Industry alliances (e.g., with [Tata Consultancy Services](#)) for resource sharing and practical training.

Community Engagement: Students participate in field visits, awareness drives, and community engagement programs that align with SDGs such as clean water initiatives, health awareness camps, and educational outreach for marginalized groups. Outreach programs on health, agriculture, and ethical practices (e.g., TB training, PPVFR Act awareness).

17.4.4 Sustainability Literacy Year: 2024

Swami Vivekanand Subharti University is deeply committed to the principles of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), with a strategic focus on SDG 17: Partnerships for the Goals. This document provides evidence for Metric 17.4.4, demonstrating how the university's educational framework systematically integrates the SDGs into its teaching and learning processes. The university achieves this through a multi-pronged approach: **curriculum integration** across diverse programs, **dedicated research and publications**, **compulsory extension and outreach activities**, and **strategic national and international partnerships**.

The university believes that true education is one that empowers individuals to become agents of positive change in society. The SDGs provide a perfect global framework to operationalize this philosophy. SDG 17 acts as a catalyst and enabler, with the university actively promoting the goals through partnerships (17.16, 17.17) and implementing their principles within its core educational functions, as detailed in this 17.4.4 report.

Evidence for Metric 17.4.4: Education for the SDGs

This section is structured to provide clear evidence for the university's efforts in promoting the SDGs through its education.

3.1 Curriculum Integration and Review

SVSU has undertaken a systematic review of its curriculum to embed sustainability and SDG-related concepts.

Specific Courses:

- **B.Tech./ M.Tech:** Courses on **Environmental Engineering, Renewable Energy Systems, Green Building Architecture, and Sustainable Waste Management** directly address SDGs 7, 9, 11, 12, and 13.
- **MBA:** Specialized modules on **Sustainable Business Practices, Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR), Business Ethics, and Social Entrepreneurship** align with SDGs 8, 9, 10, 12, and 17.
- **Medical & Health Sciences (MBBS, Nursing, Pharmacy):** Core curriculum includes **Community Medicine, Public Health Nutrition, Epidemiology, and Health Policy**, directly contributing to SDG 3. Training emphasizes serving rural and underserved communities (SDG 10).
- **Law:** Courses on **Environmental Law, Human Rights Law, and Constitutional Law** educate future jurists on the legal frameworks supporting SDGs 5, 10, 13, and 16.
- **Arts & Humanities:** Programs incorporate studies on **sustainable development, gender equality, peace studies, and Indian culture and heritage**, supporting SDGs 4, 5, 11, and 16.

Interdisciplinary Approach: The university encourages interdisciplinary projects and electives, allowing students from management, engineering, and law to collaborate on real-world problems like smart city planning (SDG 11) or healthcare access models (SDG 3).

3.2 Teaching and Learning: Student Engagement

Education at the university extends beyond the classroom to include experiential learning focused on the SDGs.





Fig. 34: Outreach activity was organised by the Swami Vivekanand Subharti University, Meerut




Fig. 35: Research Facilities at the Swami Vivekanand Subharti University, Meerut

- **Affordable medical diagnostics** (SDG 3): Swami Vivekanand Subharti University, Meerut offers affordable medical diagnostics via its associated health facilities, aiming to provide cost-effective diagnostic services for students and the wider community regardless of background. The university's medical centre supports accessibility by keeping base diagnostic tests at modest cost and integrating diagnostic training into curricula, reinforcing a service-and-learning model.
- **Water purification technologies** (SDG 6): Swami Vivekanand Subharti University, Meerut implemented water purification technologies across its campus to ensure safe and sustainable water usage. The university utilized filtration and RO-based systems to provide clean drinking water and promoted research and awareness on water conservation and purification methods among students and staff.
- **Alternative energy sources** (SDG 7): Swami Vivekanand Subharti University, Meerut actively promoted the use of alternative energy sources through the installation of solar power systems across the campus to reduce dependence on conventional energy. The university also organized awareness programs and research initiatives on renewable and sustainable energy practices to foster environmental responsibility among students and staff.
- **Sustainable agricultural practices** (SDG 2): Swami Vivekanand Subharti University, Meerut promoted sustainable agricultural practices through research, training, and community outreach programs focusing on organic farming, soil conservation, and water management. The university encouraged farmers and students to adopt eco-friendly technologies and sustainable crop production methods to enhance environmental and economic sustainability.

- **Publications:** Faculty regularly publish research papers in reputed journals on topics like public health, environmental science, and sustainable materials, contributing to the global knowledge base for the SDGs.
