2. Objectives of Feedback Process


- To make core curriculumconfiguration a vibrant one and at the same time keeping a close vigil on the demand of industry.



Employer feedback is the most important indicator of the success of any Higher Educational Institution. The employer feedback for the year 2019-2020 revealed the following:

- 96% employers have the opinion that the curriculum has relevance to the industrial needs.
- 99% employers also observed that the curriculum is capable of imparting leadership qualities.
- 94% of the employers appreciated the ability of curriculum in enhancing problem solving mentality.
- 24% of the employers suggested to enhance the leaning of the curriculum to adopt new methods and technology.






Analysis of the alumni feedback for the year 2019-2020 revealed the following points:




