Shaheed Baba Deep Singh, Department of Home science organized a value-added course, Dr. Nishma Singh started this course on 8.1.2018, 28 students were participated in this session, Dr. Nishma said that ECCE promotes brain development and has positive long-term economic benefits. Developing 21st Century Skills in early learners helps prepare them for success in school and life. ECCE can make a positive difference in the lives of young children. Age-appropriate use of technology can enhance learning. Quality early childhood education can make a significant contribution to the physical, psychomotor, cognitive, social and emotional development of the child, including the acquisition of languages and early literacy.

The first eight years of a child's life is a period of tremendous growth and development. Brain connections multiply exponentially in the first three years, and the potential for ensuring optimal development is very high up to age eight. It is imperative that this true 'window of opportunity' is fully used and strengthened to ensure long term benefits, not just for each individual child's development but also for the larger community. A large proportion of human brain development takes place after birth as a result of interactions with the environment – the impact of early experience has a greater influence on development than heredity. The developmental research has provided us with a picture of the normal development of children. Although individual child develops at her own pace, yet all children pass through an identifiable sequence of developmental stages, i.e., physical, cognitive, and emotional growth and change. Within these stages, they often share characteristics common to many children of the same age. The teachers and parents need to know these characteristics in order to meet their needs adequately and appropriately.
