1. Title of the Practice: “Reaching Out to Society is our Commitment”

2. Goal/Objectives of the Practice

- To facilitate the process of teaching and learning through the mode of service.
- To establish a community-institution linkage with the motto of service and thus promoting the practical learning capability of the students along with service
- To build leadership, and academic skills for strengthening the communities through service.
- To learn team building through learning to serve the nation and community.
- To lay a foundation to a healthy nation through service-oriented learning.

3. The Context

“The best way to find yourself is to lose yourself in the service of others”.

“Service to mankind is Service to God”.

Subharti University is a mission of service. It is committed to providing basic necessities of life such as healthcare and education to everyone without any bar of caste, creed, religion or any other man-made factors. It aims to bring people together by removing hatred, spreading love, building up of moral & national character, and extending service to mankind so as to make the dream of ~VASUDHAIV KUTUMABKAM come true. The entire process of teaching and learning has been designed keeping in mind this core concept and ideology. Also, the faculty members imbibe basic and universal values before embarking up teaching and developing strategies. Alongside the students are also provided opportunities to pursue and practice these values. Mere learning without practice is meaningless.

Field practicum is a key training where students receive first-hand exposure. Hence Subharti University has adopted 5 villages. The practical learning of the students can be enhanced by a combination of classroom instruction with community-based interaction and service.

The university has adopted neighbouring villages with the focus of its development and service through the engagement of students and faculty members. It also serves the purpose of linking academics with

theory and practice and the resources of the institution can be well utilized for the development of the community.

4. The Practice:

The Students and Faculty Members from Departments like Medical, Dental, Nursing, Education, Law, Journalism & Mass Communication, etc. are posted to the adopted villages for extension activities and also to fulfil their curricular requirements.

Each faculty/department plans its yearly activity on beforehand and gets its approval from the competent authority for extending the services as per plan. Such activities are regularly monitored and evaluated against present objectives. Various camps such as Composite Health, Dental, Eye Screening, Blood Donation camps, Legal Awareness, Literacy & Rights Awareness etc. are regularly organized by the Departments. Health awareness programs with regard to various diseases like Cancer, TB, Anaemia, Heart diseases etc. are also conducted in adopted and outreach areas each academic year. Other programs like awareness regarding government projects and schemes, skill training, etc are being conducted for enhancing the awareness of rural masses.

During the academic year 2022-23, total 348 activities were organized in which 149 Oral Screening and the rest activities were different activities organized in various areas of Meerut district, Many programs were organized as Yoga Camps, Nukkad Natak, Health camps, outreach activities and Training Programmes.

The students conduct surveys in rural areas to assess the problems and needs of the communities. After analysing the problems and needs, different health awareness activities like “nukkad natak”, seminars, workshops etc. are conducted to educate the masses. All the activities are conducted under the guidance & monitoring of the teachers and in the end, they make an evaluation of the outreach services.

5. Evidence of Success:

Students' interest in the learning process is ignited and encouraged through service-oriented learning. The community and the students benefit from the practice of learning through service. After villages were adopted, surveys were carried out at regular intervals, and the outcomes, following the execution of several programmes, are as follows. The community that was served had become much more conscious of

health issues. In light of the camps that were set up and the care that was given, the community's preventive and promotional health condition improved. Some of the changes noticed were that people began using government programmes, children were being sent to schools for education, etc.

The areas of survey, evaluation, and activity planning experienced significant improvements in the students' abilities. After getting introduced to the concept of learning through service, a lot of students are inspired to engage in social service.

5. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

The motivation levels were low among the people of the community to attend the camps/ awareness programs and gathering them at one place was a great difficulty. To overcome the problem, wide publicity was given about the camps and awareness programs through drum beating, banners, posters, and announcements from temples, mosques etc. The help of village Pradhan, School Teachers, ASHA workers, and other influential persons was also solicited.

The University always stood ahead in providing required resources like specialists, manpower, drugs, finance, transport etc.

6. Notes:

By adopting this methodology in community-based teaching courses, students are motivated to learn from their experiences in community service and they become productive citizens of the country and service-oriented forever. This method has helped the students to be role models and leaders of the community.


