1.6. NAAC Preparedness and Quality Assurance Mechanisms

Adding value to the discussion Dr.Vija Bhatnagar, Pro VC said that under the new models emphasis being given to Flexible learning system, Mentoring ar community orientation. Dr.D.K.Giri told that the Studens Leadership Training at University level needs more planning at I decentralized operation at Faculty and Department Level. In the strength of Dean-Student welfare is very crucial. Dr. U.K.Singh, Dr. Manoj Ku.Tripathy and Dr. D.V.Avast is participated in the discussion.
- Beflecting upon the agenda Director Accreditation told that order to broaden the scope of academic operation in the University the Honorable Vice-Chancellor has approved proposal to include Dean-Research, Research Officer CRS-

Faculty of Medicine and Dean-Students welfare in the Review Meetin;
They will give a presentation on their area of operation in eve y monthly review meeting, so that this will be ideally disseminated amongst the academic leaders of the University.

- Academic Innovations (Fully Flexible Credit System (FFCS: c) Starting the discussion on the point Dr.D.K.Giri told that FFCS's a academic innovation which enhance the learning capacity f the students. In the system the flexibility given in:- number | f credits registered (add to the approved credits/courses/activitie:), order of selection of courses, selection of class Timings, selection of Faculty, selection of Venue. Even autonomy is given to each student to make his/her own unique timetable, their own Cour e Plan for the entire Programme period. It is a unique academ c innovation which allows both slow and fast learners to choo e courses according to their academic abilities. Adding value to tle discussion Dr. Sanjay Kumar told that, in order to implement the FFCS we have to develop awareness among our faculty membe s as well as students. We should also consider our priorities at 1 work on prerequisites.
- d) Computer application should be a compulsory course in a l programs across discipline: The matter placed was noted f r implementation in all Academic Programs of the University.
- Exercise: Talking on the point Hon'ble Vice Chancellor to 1 that it should be the accountability of each Principal/ Directed / Dean to prepare an action plan for adopting the following be to practices (but not limited to) on Brand Building and Bend Marking Exercise for disseminating the achievements of the Faculties/Departments. They may include external experts in the team. The teaching audit format has already been circulated.
- Regulatory bodies at a glance: It is observed that the regulatory bodies are placing lot of information on their website and ask compliance from the instaurations recognized by them. Therefor it is imperative on the part of Principal/Dean/Director to visit the website regulatory bodies such as BCI, PCI, MCI, DCI, INC, NCTE and AIC and keep an eye on the recent development.
