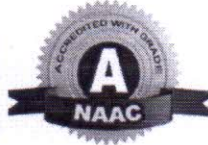

GENERAL:-

- This ordinance may be called “**Ordinance Relating to Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) in Aviation and Airport Management Programme**”.
- It shall come into force from academic session 2023-2024.

1. INTRODUCTION

Acharya Vishnu Gupt Subharti College of Management & Commerce has been established in 2008 under Swami Vivekanand Subharti University, Meerut with the vision to **chisel competent and ethical tailor-made managers and entrepreneurs to contribute to the Nation Building by developing the Institute as a centre of excellence through multidisciplinary, interdisciplinary & transformative academic approaches.**

Mission to establish the AVGSCMC was specifically centralized to focus on:

- **To impart quality education with an emphasis on human values**
- **To excel an extensive research-driven environment through multidisciplinary & interdisciplinary learning**
- **To ensure the holistic development of students through the judicious blend of curricular and co-curricular activities**
- **To ensure sustainable development of students through academic partnerships at the national & global levels and by maintaining a strong academic-industry interface.**

BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (BBA) **In Aviation & Airport Management**

i. PROGRAMME OBJECTIVES:

1. To develop the ability among students for analysing business-related problems.
2. To provide opportunity for students to work as part of teams on multidisciplinary projects.
3. To provide students with a sound foundation in the management fundamentals leading to application.
4. To promote student awareness of the life-long learning and to introduce them to professional ethics and codes of professional practice

Specifically, the objectives of the BBA(Aviation & Airport Management) Programme are:

1. To provide basic understanding of Management Education to students.
2. To develop skills in students for employment in Aviation industry.
3. To stimulate in students an interest in research and initiate them into research methodologies.
4. To foster thinking minds that are sensitive to societal needs and issues thus making them good human beings and responsible members of the society.
5. To prepare students for successful careers in industry that meet the needs of Indian and multinational companies.

ii. PROGRAMME OUTCOME:

After successful completion of the programme, an individual will be able:

1. To apply knowledge of management theories and practices to solve business problems.
2. To Foster Analytical and critical thinking abilities for data-based decision making.
3. To be abreast with the e-business solutions in the current environment led by technology disruptions.
4. To develop ethical and value-based leadership ability.
5. To understand, analyse and communicate regional, national, global economic, legal, and ethical aspects of business.
6. To lead themselves and others in the achievement of organizational goals, contributing effectively to a team environment.
7. To foster Work ethics for the good of others and translate into a good citizen.
8. To become environment caring, good and responsible member of society.

2. RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR ADMISSION IN BBA(A&AM)

- 2.1 For admission in Bachelor of Business Administration(Aviation & Airport Management) programme, the applicant should have passed with a minimum aggregate of 45% (40% for SC/ST) in 12th Class or equivalent from a recognized University.
- 2.2.1 The applicants may be required to appear at an entrance test followed by group discussion, interview and counselling before admission.
- 2.2.2 The reservation and relaxation for SC/ST/OBC/PWD and other categories shall be as per the rules of the Central Government/State Government, whichever is applicable.
- 2.3. The entire programme has to be completed within a maximum of five years from the date of original admission in the programme.

3. CURRICULUM/ STRUCTURE OF PROGRAMME OF BBA(A&AM)

The programme shall be spread over three academic years, spread over six semesters comprising actual teaching for a minimum of 90 days in each semester.

3.3 Choice Based Credit System (CBCS):

The CBCS provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising core, elective/minor or skill-based courses. The courses can be evaluated following the grading system, which is considered to be better than the conventional marks system. Therefore, it is necessary to introduce uniform grading system in the entire higher education in India. This will benefit the students to move across institutions within India to begin with and across countries. The uniform grading system will also enable potential employers in assessing the performance of the candidates. In order to bring uniformity in evaluation system and computation of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) based on student's performance in examinations, the UGC has formulated the guidelines to be followed.

BBA(Aviation & Airport Management) Under National Education Policy (NEP)

The curriculum offers a total of Courses/Papers which the student has to complete for the award of BBA(A&AM) degree. Total no. of credits required for the award of BBA (Aviation & Airport Management) degree are 150 credits. **BBA(Aviation & Airport Management) Under MOU with Prabhu Drone Research & Development LLP represented through Aradaha Education.**

- a. Refer to 3.5.1 for first year. Refer to 3.5.2 for second year. Refer to 3.5.3 for third year.
- b. All Courses and Papers are compulsory.
- c. The Student will complete one of the four Specializations i.e. Airport Ground Handling, Flight Operations, Heliport Construction Regulations, Aviation Regulations. The same will be mentioned on the student's degree.

The program offers Exit options as per NEP. Details are as follows:

- a. Exiting after first year with all papers cleared will lead to award of 'Diploma in Business Management (Aviation & Airport Management)'.
- b. Exiting after second year with all papers cleared will lead to award of 'Advanced Diploma in Business Management(Aviation & Airport Management)'
- c. Completion of 3 years of the program with all papers cleared will lead to Award of 'Bachelor in Business Administration(Aviation & Airport Management)'.

1. **Core Course:** A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.
2. **Elective Course:** Generally, a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

2.1 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course Elective courses may be offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).

2.2 Dissertation/Project Work: An elective course of 6 credits designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work, and candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project work. A Project/Dissertation work may be given in lieu of a discipline specific elective paper.

2.3 Generic Elective Course (GEC): An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure to other subjects/disciplines is called a Generic Elective Course.

P.S.: A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and vice versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.

3. Ability Enhancement Courses: The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: AE Compulsory Course (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). AECC courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement. They [(i) Environmental Science, (ii) English/MIL Communication] are *mandatory* for all disciplines. SEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.

All core courses have a practical component, along with theory. Ability Enhancement courses are theory based and Skills Enhancement courses have theory with the practical component if required. However external practical evaluation is offered only for compulsory subjects.

4. Experiential Learning: Experiential Learning is the process of learning by doing. By engaging students in hands-on experiences and reflection, they are better able to connect theories and knowledge learned in the classroom to real-world situations. The programme has 5 courses on Experiential Learning, each from 2nd semester to 6th Semester. They are compulsory and will be based on Field visits or industrial visits.

3.4 The academic calendar shall be as follows: -

1st, 3rd & 5th Semester	Session - 1st Aug. to 30th Nov Exam - 1st Dec. to 15th Dec

4. EXAMINATION AND EVALUATION

4.1 ATTENDANCE:

The students are expected to attend all the classes and should not have less than 75 % attendance in theory as well as in practical classes, wherever held, to become eligible to appear for the university examination. Short fall in attendance can, however be condoned in deserving cases to the extent of 10% by the Principal. If the short fall is more than 10% but not more than 15%, the Principal may recommend deserving cases to the Vice Chancellor for condonation. The order of the Vice Chancellor in this regard shall be final.

4.2 EXAMINATION:

All Courses offered by AVGSCMC under BBA programme will have an evaluation system within two components as:

1. Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) accounting for 25% of the final grade that a student gets in a course.
2. End-Semester Examination (ESE) accounting for the remaining 75% of the final grade that the student gets in a course.

A student will have to pass both the components i.e. CCA and ESE separately to become eligible to be declared successful in a course.

4.2.1 CONTINUOUS COMPREHENSIVE ASSESSMENT (CCA) :

Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) will be of **25 marks in case of BBA programme under NEP** comprised of:

- 4.2.1.1 Midterm written test / practical including in-between snap tests if any shall carry **10 marks in BBA programme under NEP.**
- 4.2.1.2 Class test, Group assignment, Class presentation included during regular class teaching if any shall carry **5 marks** independently in each subject in BBA programme under NEP.
- 4.2.1.3 A maximum of **10 marks** in each subject shall be awarded for attending classes (theory / practical) in BBA programme under NEP as per the following norms:

4.2.1.4 In case of **Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) & Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)** where Continuous Comprehensive Assessment is out of 15. Marks will be awarded out of 5 for each of 4.2.1.1, 4.2.1.2 and 4.2.1.3

4.2.2 END SEMESTER EXAMINATION (ESE)

The remaining 75% in case of BBA programme under NEP of the final grade of the student in a course will be assessed on the basis of an end semester examination (ESE) that will be for three hours duration and will cover the entire syllabus of the course.

The question papers for the ESE will be set by a selected faculty panel approved by the Controller of Examinations (CoE) of the Swami Vivekanand Subharti University (SVSU).

4.2.2.1 Practical Evaluation in BBA(A&AM)-201P, BBA(A&AM)-202P, BBA(A&AM)-403 P, 23AT-A1-P/ 23AT-B1-P/ 23AT-C1-P/ 23AT-D1-P, 23AT-A2-P/ 23AT-B2-P/ 23AT-C2-P/ 23AT-D2-P, 23AT-A3-P/ 23AT-B3-P/ 23AT-C3-P/ 23AT-D3-P , 23AT-A4-P/ 23AT-B4-P/ 23AT-C4-P/ 23AT-D4-P

- a) The Student will make a practical file in all the concerned practical evaluation outlining
 - i. Lesson Name
 - ii. Objective of the lesson
 - iii. Observation
 - iv. Discussion
 - v. Practical Application.
- b) Internal Assessment will be out of 15 marks and external Assessment will be out of 35 marks. Total Assessment will out of 50 marks and will be based on the maintenance of practical file and viva voce based on it.
- c) All Practical will be of 2 credit each.
- d) External Assessment will be carried out by External Expert appointed by the university.

4.2.2.2 Experiential Learning BBA(A&AM)-EL 1, BBA(A&AM)-EL2, BBA(A&AM)-EL3, BBA(A&AM)-EL4 and BBA(A&AM)-EL5

- a) The Student will undertake Industrial Visit every Semester from 2nd to 6th semester
- b) The student will be required to make a spiral bound soft-copy of minimum 25 pages based on the industrial visit.
- c) The report will comprise of Title Page, Contents, Company Profile, Objectives of Study, Discussion and Conclusion. Illustrations, photographs and Diagrams will be included as per requirement.
- d) The report will carry a certificate from the faculty who will supervise the industrial visit and a certificate from the Dean, Faculty of Management & Commerce.
- e) Internal Assessment will be out of 15 marks and external Assessment will be out of 35 marks. Total Assessment will out of 50 marks and will be based on the Report and viva voce based on it.
- f) Each experiential learning will be of 2 credits.
- g) External Assessment will be carried out by External Expert appointed by the university.

4.2.3 Major Research Project (BBA(A&AM)-601

- a. In the sixth semester, the student has to undergo an extensive field work. on a problem/topic to be assigned by the Department under the supervision of a Mentor appointed by the MOU Partner.

- b. The purpose of this is to develop higher level problem solving skills.
- c. The Research project will carry 100 marks.
- d. The Project Work would have to be completed within 90 days from the date of approval of the synopsis. After which the student will present the finished work before the Research Project committee on a predefined date. Changes suggested must be incorporated by the student in the final submission. If the student fails to appear for the presentation, he/she will be given a second chance only on medical grounds.
- e. The External examination will be conducted by External Examiner appointed by the University.
- f. The report will contain the objectives and scope of the study, research methodology, use and importance of the study, analysis of the data collected, conclusions and recommendations. It will contain appropriate charts, diagrams and bibliography. The student will give declaration for authenticity of the work. A certificate of the Supervisor and the Head of the Institution certifying the authenticity of the report shall be attached therewith. The student will submit three copies of the report. The number of pages in the report will be 75 or more. The report should be typed in A-4 size paper.
- g. The Research Project will have to be compliant on university rules related to Plagiarism and research Ethics.
- h. The Research Project will be equal to 6 credits.

4.2.4 Peer Pressure Handling Interview Preparation (BBA(A&AM)-602)

- a. In 6th Semester Core Course on Peer Pressure Handling Interview Preparation will be held. There is Internal Assessment 25 marks and External Assessment of 75 marks in the course which is of 6 credits.
- b. The external assessment will be done by external expert appointed by the university.

4.2.5 Comprehensive Viva Voce (BBA (A&AM)-603)

In 6th semester comprehensive viva voce will be held. It will be compulsory subject. Marks will be awarded out of 100 by external examiner appointed by the university. It will be of 6 credits.

4.3 PAPER SETTING

The work of setting the end semester examination papers and evaluation of scripts and conduct of the end semester practical examination shall be assigned to the course teachers as well as to outsiders, ordinarily in the ratio of 50:50 for internal and external valuation respectively.

4.3 RESULTS

The result shall be prepared at the end of each academic year of the course by aggregating the marks obtained in the theory and practical examinations in all the semesters of the course till date.

1. A candidate shall be declared as passed at the end of an academic year if he/she secures minimum 40% marks in each theory & practical paper separately (including project reports and comprehensive viva) and 40% in aggregate.

2. If a student obtained 40% marks in at least 50% of the papers (ignoring fractions) including project report, he/she will be provisionally promoted to the next year with carryover papers and will have to appear & obtain pass marks in carryover papers along with the subsequent regular examinations for the relevant semester.

3. If a candidate fails in only one head/subject and having passed in all other head/subject of the given examination of the year than his/her deficiency of maximum five (05) marks may be fulfilled by grace marks after fulfilling the conditions given below:

(A) If a candidate fails in only one head/subject and having passed in all other heads/subjects of the given examination of a **semester*/year**, then his/her deficiency of marks may be fulfilled by grace marks under the following conditions:-

- (i) Grace marks are not a matter of right of the student but are the discretion of the University.
- (ii) Provided that the candidate has appeared in the main examination of the concerned course and falls short of pass marks by not more than five (05) marks in theory paper only. Benefit of above mentioned shall not be given to the candidate who had appeared in supplementary/special examination/carry over examination.
- (iii) Further, benefit of grace marks may be given only to the candidate who will pass the entire concerned examination of the **semester*/year** after awarding the grace marks and not for the purpose of promoting the student to next year with back papers or for improvement of division or percentage.
- (iv) If in a head/subject of an examination passing in Theory, Practical or sessional exams separately is mandatory, then the benefit of grace marks shall be given only in Theory examination of the University examination.
- (v) The award of grace marks permissible shall be on the basis of 1 grace mark for every 05 marks secured by an examinee over and above the minimum passing aggregate marks of all subjects of the year.

(B) Awarding of Grace Marks shall be done as given below:-

(i) Total number of Grace Marks given to the student will be marked with astrick (*) at the bottom of the marksheet.

* Grace marks in semester examination will be considered hereinafter.

- (d) A student not covered by clause (a) to (c) above shall have the following options to complete his/her course -
 - (i) He/ she may take admission on payment of full annual course fee and repeat the entire year of study. He /She shall be treated as a regular student. Or
 - (ii) He /She may pay only University exam fee for the End Semester Examination and appear in the End Semester University exams directly. He /She shall not be allowed to attend classes and the Sessional marks obtained earlier shall be retained. Or
 - (iii) He /She may pay half of the annual course fee and attend classes. The sessional marks obtained by him/her earlier shall be retained. There will not be any requirement of minimum attendance for appearing in the University examination

- (e) A student will not be promoted to the next academic year if the carryover papers are more than 50% at one point of time.

5. EVALUATION UNDER GRADING ASSESSMENT

The minimum Grade/ Grade Point required to pass each paper in a semester examination under CBCS shall be Grade D/ Grade Point 4 in each theory paper/ Practical/Project (wherever applicable) in External Examination and Internal Assessment separately.

5.2 COMPUTATION OF SGPA AND CGPA

$(S_i) = \frac{\sum (C_i \times G_i)}{\sum C_i}$, where C_i is the number of credits of the i th course and G_i is the grade point scored by the student in the i th course.

$CGPA = \frac{\sum (C_i \times S_i)}{\sum C_i}$ where S_i is the SGPA of the i th semester and C_i is the total number of credits in that semester.

The SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to 2 decimal points and reported in the transcripts.
