Swami Vivekanand Subharti University (SVSU), inspired by the ideals of Swami Vivekananda, firmly upholds a well-defined ethical framework that is reflected in its vision, mission, and publicly available strategic documents. The university's guiding motto, “शिक्षा, सेवा, संस्कार एवं राष्ट्रीयता” (*Education, Service, Values, and Nationalism*), forms the core of its institutional philosophy and ethical orientation. This motto emphasises not only academic excellence but also the development of moral character, a spirit of service, cultural values, and a deep sense of national responsibility.

Throughout all of its academic and administrative procedures, SVSU actively supports moral principles like honesty, integrity, respect for diversity, fairness, inclusivity, and social commitment. These principles are upheld by open governance, fair opportunities, and a nurturing learning environment. They are also ingrained in institutional rules. The university promotes respect for one another among employees and students from all backgrounds, guaranteeing an inclusive and dignified culture.

In keeping with its slogan, SVSU incorporates moral principles into both academic and extracurricular activities, motivating students to participate in nation-building, environmental sustainability, and community service projects. These ideals are further reinforced in day-to-

day campus life by initiatives like planting trees, using renewable energy, and recognising national heroes.

Consequently, by means of its well-defined ethical principles and its slogan, "*शिक्षा, सेवा, संस्कार, एवं राष्ट्रियता*", SVSU ensures that its commitment to value-based education is not only documented but also visibly practised, shaping responsible, self-reliant, and ethically grounded individuals.

Incorporating Indian Values and Culture into Contemporary Education. The project named "Aligning Modern Education with Indian Values and Culture" at Swami Vivekanand Subharti University seeks to integrate ethical principles and Indian cultural heritage into its academic framework. This initiative highlights values like peace, compassion, and social responsibility through a curriculum centered on ethical teachings. It promotes community engagement by hosting workshops and seminars that underscore the significance of these values in today's society. The program also advocates for interdisciplinary collaboration, enriching educational experiences with perspectives from various fields. By embedding Indian cultural values and history, the university prepares students to tackle modern challenges while valuing their heritage. Furthermore, the university has introduced two value-added courses, Rashtrabodh and Indian Knowledge System, which are mandatory for all students this session to acquaint them with the nation's rich knowledge heritage and to inspire further research. The courses aim to: Provide students with an understanding of India's history and national symbols. Enable students to analyze the contributions of National Heroes. Enable students to examine the role of National Organizations in the freedom movement. Encourage students to appreciate various national facts. Indian Knowledge System-Equip students with an understanding of Indian culture and heritage. Enable students to apply knowledge about the contributions of ancient Indian scholars in science, philosophy, and related fields. Enable students to assess Indian Knowledge and apply it sensibly in the present context. Instill a sense of pride in students, encouraging them to become worthy citizens of the nation.

National Symbols, National Heroes, and both male and female Indian Freedom Fighters were highlighted at Swami Vivekanand Subharti University, along with their contributions. The visit to Shaheed Upwan honored Param Vir Chakra (PVC) recipients. The significance of the Azad Hind and INA in India's independence, as well as the roles of Jugantar, Abhinav Bharat Secret Society, and Kotwaldasta in the freedom struggle, were emphasized. The Gadar Party's objectives, Indian conflicts after independence, Atmiya Sabha, and Meerut's role in the freedom movement were also discussed, along with Belur Math. The institution integrates

crosscutting issues such as Gender, Environment and Sustainability, Human Values, Health Determinants, Right to Health Issues, Emerging demographic changes, and Professional Ethics into its curriculum. For the 2024-2025 academic year, the University offers around 843 courses that include essential topics like Gender, Environment, Human Values, Health Determinants, and Health. This integration is achieved through Value Added Courses, seminars, guest lectures, and the participation of distinguished speakers, promoting awareness among students. To incorporate relevant topics on gender, environment and sustainability, human values, health determinants, health rights, emerging demographic shifts, and professional ethics into our courses, various activities have been conducted throughout the academic year.

The University is committed to enhancing quality education and fostering social responsibility through a variety of outreach programs within the local community. These efforts focus on education, environmental concerns such as Swachh Bharath, health and hygiene awareness, and socio-economic development. Students and staff carry out these initiatives, which involve financial expenditures throughout the year. Guided by NCC, NSS, UBA, and other extension programs, the University tackles a broad spectrum of issues, including environmental sustainability and socio-economic growth. To address healthcare needs, the University provides free or subsidized medical services, such as dialysis and cancer treatment, to patients from camps, peripheral centers, adopted villages, and orphanages. Promoting communal harmony is a fundamental value, with all festivals celebrated inclusively and with enthusiasm. In tackling socio-economic challenges, faculty from law, management, and commerce organize awareness programs and problem-solving camps to improve managerial skills, legal literacy, and financial and technological knowledge in targeted local communities. Over the year, the University has conducted so many social responsibility activities in the neighbourhood community.

Sustainable Development Goal 16 – Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions focus on promoting peaceful and inclusive societies, providing access to justice for all, and building effective, accountable and inclusive institutions.

In 2024, Swami Vivekanand Subharti University, Meerut took a deliberately integrated approach to SDG 16 by combining:

- Legal literacy and awareness activities,
- Free legal aid and outreach in nearby villages,
- Youth parliaments and Constitution-focused events,

- Vigilance and anti-corruption education, and Policy-level commitments like anti-ragging mechanisms and institutional legal aid structures.

The initiatives were primarily spearheaded by the Sardar Patel Subharti Institute of Law (Subharti Law College), the Swami Vivekanand Chair, the Faculty of Arts & Social Sciences, the Department of Journalism & Mass Communication, and central university authorities, in partnership with organizations like the District Legal Services Authority (DLSA), Meerut, and the Dedicated Freight Corridor Corporation of India Ltd (DFCCIL). The Faculty of Law at the university serves as a crucial institutional support for SDG 16, focusing on peace, justice, and strong institutions. The Sardar Patel Subharti Institute of Law offers students structured experiences through legal aid camps, internships, moot courts, and court-focused training, equipping them to become future judges, advocates, civil servants, and human rights defenders. The Subharti Free Legal Aid Clinic and Law Club conduct regular outreach programs in nearby rural areas, providing free legal advice and linking citizens with government initiatives. The moot court facilities and frequent competitions replicate real court settings, fostering respect for due process, fair hearings, and thorough legal research, which are fundamental values of robust justice institutions.
