Findings of the Seminar:

Following Common challenges in implementation of NEP 2020 were found:-

1. For the new education policy, the government will spend 6% of GDP on education. The situation has not been clear on how the government will arrange for such a huge amount for the expenditure.
2. Problem regarding mother tongue - for example, in a union territory like Delhi, people from different states of the country live, in such a situation it is not possible to learn different mother tongues in the same school.
3. A challenge for the government will also be that at present, commercialization and privatization have taken the education sector in its grip.
4. A significant challenge relates to the lack of infrastructure. It is commonly observed that schools and universities have a lack of electricity, water, toilets, boundary walls, libraries, computers, and other physical facilities etc., as a result of which the education system is affected.

5. The breadth and diversity of India's education sector due to cultural, social and economical diversity.
6. Welfare activities of the country are going on with public and private sector partnership. It is a big challenge to implement the National Education Policy 2020 in the private body, especially in higher education.
7. Challenges related to curriculum implementation at grass root level.
8. Challenges related to transparent evaluation systems at every level of education.
9. The education of India is included in the Concurrent List; the central government has prepared the National Education Policy 2020 but the states have to do the analysis and implement the NEP 2020.

Following Common Resolutions are-

1. To face the challenges, all the stakeholders related to education will have to make joint efforts.
2. Education policy will have to be implemented from the grass-root level and a strong strategy will have to be made for the implementation.
3. Need analysis of stakeholders from local level is a primary condition for the successful implementation of NEP 2020.

Outcome of the National seminar:

1. Awareness was generated about the challenges in the implementation of NEP 2020
2. Awareness was generated about the resolutions for the challenges in the implementation of NEP 2020
3. Participants Learned about NEP 2020 in detail, Challenges will be faced during implementation of NEP 2020, and its resolutions also, Teacher's new roles as per NEP 2020, challenges will come in practically implementing the provisions made in the new education Policy and how we can solve them. how can we make all-round development of children by using these provisions, Different aspects to improve education system, The importance of NEP 2020, its objectives, points regarding its implementation, The present policy has enough provisions for the betterment of the current education system of the country, the

need is the best efforts from the stakeholders to make it successful. Got a lot of information and knowledge related to the NEW EDUCATION POLICY 2020

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

Objective of the Activity:-

The objective of the workshop was to enhance an educator's ability to use Bloom's taxonomy and to support students' higher-order thinking by starting with lower-level cognitive abilities. For the purpose of demonstrating how Bloom's taxonomy can be incorporated into more comprehensive educational objectives, behavioral and cognitive learning outcomes. Additionally, the workshop's goal was to improve evaluation methods by using question papers and the Bloom's Taxonomy.

Focused Area:-

The workshop's main area of concentration was education using Bloom's Taxonomy. The workshop was held to introduce the faculty to the outcome-based evaluation approach and to create test questions that complied with Bloom's taxonomy. The standard of an educational system's assessment procedures has a stronger impact on its quality. Evidently, the curriculum and the learning experience should keep up with the level of evaluation standards when assessment requirements are set at a higher level of learning. As a result, it is accurate to say that assessment fuels student learning.

Description:-

The Sardar Patel Subharti Institute of Law organized a one-day workshop on June 22, 2023 with the theme "Enhancing Question Paper Evaluation and Outcome: A Comprehensive Examination Using Bloom's Taxonomy". Prof. (Dr.) Viabhav Goel Bhartiya, Dean of the Faculty of Law at S.V. Subharti University, Meerut, welcomed everyone and provided an overview of the workshop. He discussed the reality of the teaching-learning process and commented on the rapid transition from conventional classroom instruction to outcome-based instruction. According to him, this taxonomy can help teachers by giving a hierarchy of levels, which they can use to construct performance assignments, create discussion topics for. As a special invitee to the workshop, Dr. Neetu Panwar, Director of IQAC SV Subharti University, Meerut, attended. During the workshop, Ajay Raj Singh, an assistant professor at the Sardar Patel Subharti Institute of Law, discussed the domains of Bloom's Taxonomy, specifically the cognitive, affective, and psychomotor domains. He provided a thorough comparison of the old Bloom's

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Taxonomy concept with the new revised Bloom's Taxonomy for developing performance tasks, creating discussion questions for learners, and giving comments on student work. This resource is separated into levels, each of which has a set of keywords that best describe it and questions that specifically address that level of critical thinking.

All participants were instructed to create a question paper using an action verb from Bloom's taxonomy at the conclusion of the session. The paper was due on June 26, 2023.









Figure 2: Glimpse of our Speaker presenting the lecture




**Session Two: "Understanding Learner engagement Imperatives in the Knowledge Economy"**
